A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2027.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The monies in Section 3 are appropriated from the named funds for the 2027 fiscal year to the state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

"Total" shall mean the aggregate total appropriation of all funding sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be

directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

Section 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2027, to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been

or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay date falls.

(b) All appropriations made in Section 3 shall be at the program level. Any directed expenditure of funds below a program shall be from funds appropriated for the program.
